Air Freight	Discuss air freight as a mode of shipment and documentation and practical issues for this mode.
Ocean Freight	Discuss ocean freight as a mode of shipment and documentation and practical issues for this mode.
Intermodal Shipments	Define and describe intermodal transportation within international freight.
Documentation	Identify and utilize shipping documentation and forms and review requirements common to all countries.
Regulation	Identify and understand regulations related to the shipping of goods across borders.
Terminology	Define and utilize terminology critical to logistics and supply chains, including Incoterms®
Insurance	Describe insurance sources and considerations related to international shipments to include liabilities, loss, and damage claims.
Packaging and Crating	Define and describe containers, packaging and crating options. Identify labeling best practices and requirements.
Warehouses and Free Trade Zones	Identify appropriate uses of bonded customs warehouses and free trade zones.
Logistics Processes	Apply best practices to discussions of automation, technology used to monitor and control logistics, and other elements of monitoring and control.
Agency and Scope	Define the scope, responsibilities, and legal authority of the freight forwarder.
Terminology	Define and apply common terms used within international trade.
